Targets for Gender Statistics in SIAP

- Integrating the gender perspective in the production, analysis, use and dissemination of official statistics is the goal of SIAP training courses on gender statistics.
- The training approach also takes the perspective that gender statistics cuts across all fields of statistics and focuses on building capacity of statistical institutions to produce and disseminate core gender statistics and indicators and to improve coordination with users of gender statistics


