GEOGRAPHY CONDITION (2013)

Total area : 1,910,931 km²

Islands : 17,504 Provinces : 34

Districts : 511 (413 R + 98 C)

Sub Districts : 6,982 Villages : 80,714

2. Indonesia NLFS

SAKERNAS

- Household survey
- Specifically designed to collect information on labor force statistics
- ☐ Time of data collection:
 - Firstly conducted in 1976
 - Annually conducted in 1986-2004
 - Semesterly conducted since 2005
 February : Provincial estimate
 August : District estimate





- Sampling method: Stratified Block Census
- ☐ **District estimate** (3 stages stratified sampling):
 - 1st: selecting 25% CB with Probability Proportional to Size
 - 2nd: selecting n CB with systematic sampling in each strata
 - 3rd: selecting 10 hh with systematic sampling in each CB
 - Sample size: 200,000 hh
- ☐ Provincial estimate (2 stages stratified sampling):
 - 1st: selecting 5,000 of 20,000 CB of district level with syst. sampling
 - 2nd: selecting 10 hh with systematic sampling
 - Sample size: 50,000 hh

Information Collected

■ Main data on individual hh members

- Persons aged 10 years and over
- Tabulation data covers persons aged <u>15 years and over</u>
- ☐ Individual data
 - Identity

Name, relation to head of hh, sex, age, marital status, and educational attainment

Activities (refers to previous week period)

Working (at least one hour), temporarily not working, looking for job, established a new business, attending school, doing housekeeping, others (retired, incapacitated, etc)

• For those who were working or on leave

Total working days, total number of hours of work, industry, occupation, employment status, and total monthly wage/salary

For those who were looking for job or established a new business
 Main reason for looking a job, type of effort to find out a job, duration of looking for a job, and type of job (full-time or part-time)



Some Basic Concepts

☐ Working age population

Persons aged 15 years and over

■ Working

An activity done by a person who worked for pay or assisted others in obtaining pay or profit for at least one hour during reference time (previous week), including unpaid worker for any economic activity

■ Labor force

Persons aged 15 years and over who were working, temporarily absent from work but having jobs, or did not have work but look for a work during the previous week

■ Not in labor foce

Persons aged 15 years and over who are not labor force, such as student, housekeeper, and others, excluding personal activity

Unemployment

- Persons without work but looking for a work
- Persons without work but not looking for a work since feel impossible (hopeless) to get a work
- Persons who have made arrangements to start work on a date subsequent to the reference period (future starts)

- 1. Own account worker
- 2. Employer assisted by temporary (unpaid) workers
- 3. Employer assisted by permanent (paid) workers
- 4. Employee
- 5. Casual employee in agriculture
- 6. Casual employee not in agriculture
- 7. Family (unpaid) workers


Occupation category








Distribution of Employment in the Informal Sectors by <u>Area</u> (%)





Percentage of Employment in the Informal Sectors by <u>Area</u>






Distribution of Employment in the Informal Sectors by <u>Age</u> (%)


Percentage of Employment in the Informal Sectors by <u>Age</u>




Percentage of Employment in the Informal Sectors by Education


Distribution of Employment in the Informal Sectors by Industry (%)

Percentage of Employment in the Informal Sectors by <u>Industry</u>






Distribution of Employment in the Informal Sectors by Occupation (%)

Percentage of Employment in the Informal Sectors by Occupation






Distribution of Employment in the Informal Sectors by Hours of work (%)
